

ICT Professionals Visit Packet

Thank you for agreeing to participate in the ICT4me program. This packet is designed to prepare you for your visit with the youth. In this packet, you'll find

- Preparation information for before and during your visit.
- Volunteer application
- Presentation content we'd like you to cover and sample presentation
- Lesson plan for the activity you'll co-lead with the program leader.
- Contact information for the program manager
- Location of and directions to the sites

BEFORE YOUR VISIT

- Design Notebooks (sketches and ideas) and/or professional portfolios if you have one to share
- Any other materials you need for your presentation and the activity with the youth.

WHEN YOU VISIT

- Provide a short (10 to 15 minutes) presentation about your and your career. See details below in the Presentation Checklist.
- Have examples of your work ready to share. Suggested items to share include: Design Notebooks (sketches and ideas) and/or professional portfolios if you have one to share; storyboards or other materials that show the youth how you create your product; and of course, the actual product of your work.
- Provide an overview of what your company does and the products people create.
- Allow time for questions.
- Be a positive role model physically as well as intellectually. Many (if not all) of the youth will be struggling with their body image and physical abilities. If your activity involves

physical activity, be encouraging and supportive to all youth at all levels. Show the youth how comfortable you are with your appearance and your mental and physical abilities.

	Description of your company
	Description of what you do/what someone in your career does
	Your interests outside of work
	Your interests as a middle school and high school youth; make connections from these interests to your career
	Your education path and what education is necessary for your career
	What skills or personality types map well to your career
	What advice you would give a youth interested in your career
	Plan your time. You'll have a little over an hour with the youth. Plan to talk between 10 to 15 minutes about your career, leaving approximately 10 minutes for questions from the youth. You'll need at least 30 minutes for the hands-on activity. Youth can continue to ask you questions during the activity as well.
ACTIVITY CHECKLIST & EXAMPLES	
Before you visit, the program manager will talk with you about doing a hands-on activity with the youth. She may send you a copy of the activity from the ICT4me curriculum or you might choose one of the example activities listed below. The following checklist will help you prepare to co-lead an activity from the curriculum. See the activity (attached separately) for more details. □ Read through the activity plans sent to you. You'll receive an activity plan for your session and you may also receive related activities that the youth have completed or will complete soon.	
	Come prepared to engage in the hands-on activity with the youth.
	Encourage youth to ask questions and participate. Some of the youth may exhibit low-self esteem in relation to technology and mathematics. Be positive and supportive.
	Be a positive role model physically as well as intellectually. Many (if not all) of the youth will be struggling with their body image and physical abilities. If your activity involves physical activity, be encouraging and supportive to all youth at all levels. Show the youth how comfortable you are with your appearance and your mental and physical abilities. The Site Program Manager and/or Program Coordinators will talk with you before your
	session to let you know what to expect from the youth.

If you decide with the program manager to not lead a specific activity from the ICT4me curriculum, consider the following example activities that you may want to use or they may inspire ideas of your own:

What's My Job Title Mean?

Job titles are often vague in describing what an individual actually does. Some can even be humorous.

- Have 2-3 of the ICT Professionals with the most intriguing job titles write their titles where the youth can see them.
- Ask youth to play 10 questions (probably not time for the typical 20 questions) where they ask questions of the ICT Professional in order to describe accurately what the person does.

Youth Giving Feedback

Give youth the opportunity to give you user feedback on a technology.

- Allow youth to use a new technology or review a prototype.
- Youth are guided in providing feedback by ICT professional and Site staff.
- ICT professional shares how the technology was developed.

ICT Professionals Give Feedback

Youth bring their designs or show their website and ask for feedback or help from ICT Professionals.

My Design Tools

ICT professionals share a simple design tool such as a web page template or storyboard for how they begin design. Youth use the tool to create their own design and share it with the group.
